Adrienn Szilágyi (PhD 2016) wrote her doctoral thesis on the analysis of the social and economic relations of the aristocratic and noble families in the 19th-century Békés County (forthcoming monograph in 2018). She was researcher at *Arts and Scholarship in the Service of the Nation-building in the Nineteenth-Century Hungary* (NKFI project) at HAS RCH Institute of History (2013-17). She is postdoctoral researcher doing her own project *Social network and informal structures within the estates in 19th century* (NKFI project) from September 2018, which focuses on the estate and its employees, the relations between aristocracy and nobles, individuals and communities, and the family as a social, economic and emotional community. In the research team she is responsible for the development of a family reconstruction database cutting across centuries and social groups. She aims to create a searchable, expandable, researchable historical data structure with her colleagues, which helps to understand the structure, relationships, and strategies of families, while responding to other historical problems as well.
